4-H youth development programs are grounded in the belief that kids learn best by doing. Through hands-on learning, youth build not only confidence, creativity and curiosity, but also life skills such as leadership and resiliency that will help them thrive today and their tomorrows. The Nash County 4-H youth development program offers a variety of clubs.

The Feathers 'N Fur club meets monthly, in Nashville every third Monday at the Agricultural Center. This club focuses on small companion animals with each monthly meeting featuring a live species. Kids have the opportunity to touch and learn about the animal, how to care for it and the impact the animal has on their lives. Periodically we also have guest speakers, trips, citizenship projects and presentation opportunities. Just to name a few of the species that have been presented at recent club meetings we have had a prairie dog, sled team, owls, rats and a chinchilla.

Membership in 4-H is free and open to all youth ages 5-18 years of age - as of January 1st of the current year. All 4-H clubs are led by an approved adult staff member, or volunteer, that have completed a screening process that includes background checks. Our youth club officers are selected from within each club to assist leaders while providing them an opportunity to experience leadership skills.
