4-H youth development programs are grounded in the belief that kids learn best by doing. Through hands-on learning, youth build not only confidence, creativity and curiosity, but also life skills such as leadership and resiliency that will help them thrive today and their tomorrows. The Nash County 4-H youth development program offers a variety of clubs.

The Sew What? Club meets the fourth Thursday of the month (excluding June, July, November and December) at 6:30 PM at the Nash County Agricultural Center. This club is designed for children ages 9 through 18 years and focuses on basic sewing fundamentals and skills, with the opportunity to become an advanced seamstress. We teach children the fundamental elements and operations of a sewing machine and to assist with their advancement we encourage them to practice at home. Children are required to have a machine for this club.* We do a variety of sewing projects and some of the items we have made were donated and others the children keep for themselves. A few examples are pillows for kidney dialysis patients, walker bags for nursing homes and fleece ear warmer headbands, Christmas stocking for active soldiers, shoulder tote bags, baby bibs for the pregnancy center, cupcake pin cushion, duffle bags for foster children and many other projects. To reduce cost we use donated fabric for many projects. We also offer a fun 4-day sewing camp during the summer that features a variety of different projects.

Membership in 4-H is free and open to all youth ages 5-18 years of age - as of January 1st of the current year. All 4-H clubs are led by an approved adult staff member, or volunteer, that have completed a screening process that includes background checks. Our youth club officers are selected from within each club to assist leaders while providing them an opportunity to experience leadership skills. Are you between the ages of 9 and 18 years?
