

Here are highlights of their work from 2021.

CONNECTING PEOPLE WITH PLANTS

Brunswick County - Master Gardener volunteers hosted an open house at the <u>Brunswick County Botanical Garden</u> to address new residents' questions and provide solutions for coastal gardening challenges.


Johnston County - Written by Master Gardener volunteers, "The Gardener's Dirt" monthly newsletter addresses common plant questions and alerts gardeners to <u>Be On the Look Out (BOLO)</u> for seasonal pest and plant disease issues.

Vance & Warren Counties - An expansion to the <u>demonstration</u> garden at the county Extension center allows Master Gardener volunteers to teach gardening best practices in an easily accessible setting.

SHARING A PASSION FOR PLANTS



Extension Gardener Plant Toolbox - Master Gardener volunteers contributed over 2,100 hours to enhance and expand the Plant Toolbox, which features more than 4,500 plant profiles.

Extension Gardener Handbook, 2nd Ed & Teacher's Guide - With help from Master Gardener volunteers, these two great resources are now available to gardeners and horticultural educators nationwide.

<u>Extension Gardener Online Courses</u> - Development and launch of these courses was supported by Master Gardener volunteers, who helped edit and evaluate course materials and served as online teaching assistants.

<u>Plant These Instead</u> - Master Gardener volunteers helped make this series more accessible by editing the recording subtitles.

PROMOTING POLLINATORS AND NATIVE PLANTS

Caldwell County - Through the "Nature's Best Hope Garden Challenge," Master Gardener volunteers encouraged each other and their neighbors to increase the number of native plants in their yards.

Henderson County - At a daycare center serving low-income families, Master Gardener volunteers installed plantings to enhance the playground.

Montgomery County - Master Gardener volunteers renovated a large pollinator garden and added signage that identifies each plant in the garden.

Moore County - In partnership with the Southern Pines Public Library, Master Gardener volunteers designed and installed the "Books and Bees Garden" that provides habitat for native bees and beneficial insects.

Sampson County - <u>Pollinator habitat gardens</u> created by Master Gardener volunteers demonstrate how homeowners, municipalities, businesses, and farmers can support pollinators on their property.

FINDING THE BEST BASIL



Master Gardener volunteers in **Chatham**, **Haywood**, **Onslow**, and **Pender** Counties participated in a research project to evaluate which basil cultivars are most resistant to basil downy mildew, a plant disease that is often deadly to basil plants.

Working with their Extension agent, volunteers set up test plots either in their backyard or at the local Extension center and collected data each week through the summer and fall. Their observations not only included which cultivars were most affected by basil downy mildew, but which cultivars tasted the best.

This trial will continue in the summer of 2022. Final results will be shared in Extension publications and variety recommendations will be added to the basil profile in the Plant Toolbox.


