Structural Correctness

- Evaluate when in motion
- Various other defects cause distortion of topline
- Hip Structure
- Tailhead
- Loin



Balance



 The term balanced in livestock can be interpreted in several different ways. However, balanced generally refers to the animals proportionality or symmetry from the side. In essence, do all of their pieces fit together. Does their chest and rear flank seem proportional. An animal would be considered unbalanced if their chest was deeper and their rear flank was shallower.

Which goat is nicer balanced?





Volume / Rib Shape

- Deep, outward shaped rib with width of chest and base is desired
- 3 Dimensional
 - Depth
 - Width
 - Length

Muscle

- Places to evaluate for total muscularity and thickness:
 - Base Width
 - Circumference of forearm
- Where to evaluate expression and dimension of muscle.
 - Down Top
 - Hindquarter

Muscle

 While muscle is important in females, it is important to remember that they need to look like females and be correct in their muscle shape.





Remember when selecting your project

- Genetics are crucial
- Purchase from someone you trust, at some point you will need to ask them for help.
- Have a Budget, stick to it!!
- Even the best little ones don't always turn out great!

Facilities

- Cleanliness (Note I did not say fancy, I said Clean!!)
- Dry
- Wind break

Weigh Schedule

Do NOT wait until just before the fair to weigh your animal.

- 1. When you get your animal home.
- 2. Every 2 weeks
- 3. 2 months prior to show, weigh every week.
- 4. 2 weeks before the show Small Ruminants and Pigs should weigh everyday or every other day.

We are working with Show Animals, they need a little extra love.

- You don't race a Nascar on E-85.
- You are trying to get that animal to look his absolute best.
 - Meet and exceed their nutritional needs
 - Treat them as royalty Clean pens, baths, etc...
 - Keep a close eye on them daily

- When do you Start?
 - The day your animal comes home.
 - Treat your animal as you want to be treated
 - Be Consistent
