Initial Tag-In:

- Each child needs to:
 - Declare tentative "truck" or "going home"
 - Have animal(s) date(s) of birth
 - Have Born & Raised form completed if applicable

Show & Sale Weigh-In:

- Stop #1 Each child will be given a folder with all show information and index cards for each animal to take through each stop. Will check name, tag #, & "truck" or "going home" confirmed
- Stop #2 Teeth and physical check, remove covers if needed
- Stop #3 Vet check
- Stop # 4 Scales the index card will record final weight and handed back to child/parent for their records.

Rules and Regulations Updates 2024 Revisions

• Under Entering Animals:

- 2. Exhibitors may weigh-in up to 3 animals of any or all project species at the beginning of the project. Exhibitors may bring <u>ONLY TWO</u> of each species that were weighed and recorded (at the tag in date), to be shown and sold at the show & sale in April.
- 3. All swine, lamb, steer, and goat exhibitors must designate one animal each from their entry to be sold in the sale. All Grand and Reserve Champion winners will automatically be the sale animal for that exhibitor if different from the designated animal. If exhibitor receives both Grand and Reserve Champions, both will be sold in the sale.
- Meat Goat Department re-weigh option prior to show removed

County Contracts (specific to your participating county)

- Edgecombe: (Handout provided) for options, must complete the google form for credits {must be approved by agent}. Total of 5 credits to participate in show & sale.
- Halifax: must complete the google form for credits by March 29th {must be approved by agent}. Total of 5 credits to participate in show & sale.
- <u>Nash</u>: Requires Signatures and must be turned in with PRB at the deadlines notes.

SWINE



- HOGS MUST WEIGH BETWEEN
 220-290 lbs
- HOGS ARE ALLOWED A RE-WEIGH PRIOR TO RECORDING FINAL WEIGHT

SHEEP

- ALL LAMBS MUST WEIGH MORE THAN 75 POUNDS.
- LAMBS WILL BE MOUTHED AT CHECK IN
- LAMBS MUST BE LESS THAN 12 MONTHS OF AGE
- NEITHER PREGNANT NOR LACTATING EWE LAMBS WILL BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE



GOATS



- ALL GOATS MUST WEIGH MORE THAN 50 POUNDS.
- GOATS WILL BE MOUTHED AT CHECK IN
- GOATS MUST BE LESS THAN 12
 MONTHS OF AGE
- NEITHER PREGNANT NOR LACTATING DOES WILL BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE
- HORNS MUST BE TIPPED!

BEEF CATTLE

- ALL CATTLE WILL BE ALLOWED 2 PERMANENT TEETH AT SHOW WEIGH IN
- ALL CATTLE MUST BE DEHORNED
- SCURS ARE NOT HORNS. RECURRING GROWTH CAN BE NO LONGER THAN 1 INCH.
- ONLY STEERS GRADING "SELECT" OR BETTER WILL BE GUARANTEED SUPPORT PRICE



GETTING STARTED



CHOOSING YOUR ANIMAL

• Muscle

The width down the top/back of the animal should match the width at the base.



- Balance & Eye Appeal The "Pretty Factor". Long neck, clean, overall.
- Structural Correctness Ask to walk the animal around the pen. Movements should be easy and fluid.
- **Depth of Body & Capacity** Look for animals that are "Barrel chested". They should be deep with plenty of rib shape.



ADDITIONAL RULES

- No premiums will be paid to the 4-H'er and no other livestock project can be checked in for the following year until the project record book is completed and turned in by September 1st of the current show year.
- Reissued checks for 4-Hers will have a \$25 service fee deducted from the total premium.
- For auditing purposes, participants have until December 1st to deposit their premium. After December 1st, all premiums not deposited will be donated to the show
